## **General comments**

It was a pleasure to visit this attractive village which has good facilities and is commendably free of litter.

Residents clearly work hard to keep their village tidy, with attractive gardens and well-maintained hedges. Many properties have good floral displays at the front, with a particularly good example being the splendid colourful flower baskets attached to the fence in the garden of The Cottage on Church Lane. There was an equally impressive display, including a Jubilee train at Station House on Station Road. Another attractive building was The New Inn on Station Road with a colourful range of hanging baskets and planters.

There are also good examples of community planting around the village, especially in The Square, where there is a most attractive and well-maintained wooded Memorial Garden, with trade mosaics along the path leading to a circular mosaic memorial. The garden has well-trimmed hedges, two pots of flowers and very attractive wrought iron work at the entrances.

Near the well-maintained and attractive playground are the allotments, which and well-used and productive, with well-trimmed hedges surrounding the site.

There are noticeboards outside the Village Hall, however the notices could benefit from tidying and the noticeboards needed cleaning. The bus shelter in The Square was very tidy and the pictures of local scenes on the back wall was a nice touch.
